

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



Riga's bestkept stories

Discover the most story-based museums in the Latvian capital.

Riga offers something for everyone, no matter the season. Art enthusiasts are drawn to the Latvian National Museum of Art, while technology fans delight in the wonders of the Riga Motor Museum. History lovers, for their part, make a beeline for the Museum of the History of Riga and Navigation. On a crisp winter day, when the snow blankets the ground just right, there's nothing better than a warm cup of hot chocolate and a leisurely stroll through the enchanting Ethnographic Open-Air Museum of Latvia on the city's outskirts.

But all cities have their legends, and all legends are made by people. It's said that everyone has a story to tell, so on a cold January day, why not prepare to discover some of those stories? If you're interested in medicine (but not only), don't miss Gleizds, Paper, Scissors, an exciting exhibition at the Pauls Stradinš Medicine History Museum that's dedicated to the creative experiments of photographer Jānis Gleizds (1924–2010) and the scientific surgical research of

the time. The show features stories about Soviet erotica, the aesthetics of a medically transformed body, the latest technological solutions, and plastic surgeries depicted in masterful photo collages.

Looking for more fascinating stories? Step into the Romans Suta and Aleksandra Belcova Museum located in the former apartment of these icons of classic Latvian modernism. The museum's cosy, intimate atmosphere offers a rare glimpse into the personal world of these artists, displaying their work and treasured possessions. It's not just a memorial; it's a living tribute to creativity and history.

History buffs will appreciate the Žanis Lipke Memorial Museum, often described as Riga's best-kept secret. This poignant underground bunker, which once sheltered those rescued from the Jewish ghetto during the Second World War, invites visitors on a deeply moving journey into the past.

For culture lovers, the restored Mežaparks open-air stage is a must. There you'll find the SongSpace exhibition, a tribute to Latvia's rich tradition of song and dance. Open Wednesday to Sunday in winter, it features The Largest Choir in the World. a 128-screen multimedia installation that offers an immersive and emotional exploration of the powerful legacy of Latvian song.

Proud to be Baltic!

Every year, the *airBaltic* calendar features 12 stunning photos celebrating women in the aviation industry. Now in 2025 it's also focusing on the company's Baltic roots and celebrating Baltic towns and cities.

Beāte Herta Kepša, Senior Cabin Crew: 'This is a question I'm often asked by passengers on planes, and I recommend that they go beyond the capitals to see the real essence of the Baltic countries and what people are like outside the hurried cities of Riga, Vilnius, and Tallinn. It's an opportunity to see the diversity of nature here: the sea, the forests, the marshes, the vastness of the fields, and the small towns. In Riga, I recommend that visitors go to the Splendid Palace cinema, which is one of the oldest and most beautiful cinemas in Europe. In Tallinn, watch the sunset by the water, and in Vilnius, stroll through the Old Town.'



Emīlija Hincenberga, Cabin Crew: 'The city that inspires me the most is Liepāja, on the western coast of Latvia. I find it full of warmth, affection, and also many beautiful memories. Visitors from abroad should definitely visit it at least once. I believe they'll want to return to Liepāja again and again to experience both joy and peace of mind.'



Anna Čmihova, Technical Record Keeper Supervisor: 'My recommendation when in Latvia is to go to Cape Kolka, or Kolkasrags, which is the where the Baltic Sea and the Gulf of Riga meet. For me, it's the perfect place to walk, reflect on life, regain strength and energy, feel myself, and feel myself in nature.'

FOR **FEBRUARY** Klaipėda, Lithuania



Anastasia Paupert de Rohnay, First Officer: 'Flying over the Baltics every day, I can see that the region is geographically very rich and diverse. Estonia is particularly full of beautiful natural attractions, and one of my favourite places to go there is Lahemaa, the country's largest and oldest national park. It was established more than half a century ago along the Gulf of Finland and is home to at least 200 bird species and over 900 plant species. The hiking possibilities are varied and pleasant and include a wonderful boardwalk designed to avoid damaging the bog environment. An observation tower also offers a stunning view. South of the park lies the magical Kõrvemaa Forest, and if you come at the right time, you may encounter (while keeping a safe distance!) moose, wild boar, lynx, brown bears, foxes, and other wildlife. A tip: bring binoculars and practical shoes.'



Jūlija Jeršova, First Officer: 'Td absolutely recommend visiting the Curonian Spit, or Kuršių Nerija, in Lithuania. It's a spit of land along the Baltic Sea at the far western end of the country. It's also a stunning UNESCO World Heritage Site that's known for its unique landscapes, including pristine beaches and some of the highest sand dunes in Europe. The place is very peaceful and good for resting your body and soul. It gets busier in summer but is worth visiting all year round - any season is beautiful on the Curonian Spit!'

FOR **APRIL** Pärnu, Estonia

'I'd recommend visiting the charming town of Kuldīga, which is also known as the "Latvian Venice". It's a very romantic and cosy place to spend some time away from the loud and noisy capital if you feel the need to recharge and restore your energy and inner peace.'

The sea along Latvia's western coast has a special energy that draws us to it again and again. The second place is great for the summer season and especially for those who like golf - the Ozo Golf Course in Riga. There, beginners as well as experts can combine a relaxing day outdoors with an exciting game. The 18-hole course stretches along the shores of Kīšezers Lake and into the forest, reflecting the diversity of the Latvian landscape.'



Annija Kronlaka, Cabin Crew: 'My avourite place in the Baltics is Liepāja. It's my hometown, and I'm always happy to return there. I recommend it to others, too, because it's a beautiful city that's rich in history and culture, plus it's by the sea and has a long, sandy beach. There's always something going on in Liepāja, from cultural to sporting events. I'd recommend enjoying the city in summer, when it's at its liveliest.'

If you have the opportunity to rent a car, I highly recommend visiting Sigulda, which offers breathtaking views from its hills and hillocks. And don't miss Rundāle Palace, often referred to as the "little Versailles", with its stunning Baroque architecture and meticulously designed gardens near Bauska.'



Agnese Jakoviča, Head of Digital Marketing: 'I'd recommend Alūksne and Stāmeriena in northeastern Latvia. Even in the hottest summer months there are relatively few people there. Alūksne Lake is pretty with its islets and a great beach in the city centre on Pilssala Island. Climb the Temple Hill observation tower nearby, and take the zipline across the lake for a super adventure! Afterwards, ride the narrow-gauge train to Stāmeriena and see its palace and church, which is situated in a beautiful park by the lake. And of course, swim in the clean waters of Stāmeriena Lake, where white water lilies bloom."

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


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CITIES OF THE MONTH / January

There's hardly been an artist as poetic, spiritual, profound, joyous, and personal as Marc Chagall (1887–1985), whose oeuvre spans more than 80 years. A large exhibition at the Albertina now displays 100 of his works, from early paintings made in the Russian Empire to compositions from later years in Paris and the large formats he painted in the south of France near the end of his life (until February 9; Albertinaplatz l; albertina.at). Vibrant colours, traditional village motifs, the poetics of everyday life inspired by a childhood in an Orthodox Jewish setting, spiritual scenes from the Bible - Chagall mixed it all together in a bold palette of colours. Another great exhibition, at the Albertina Modern, is the 70th-Birthday Retrospective of Erwin Wurm, a contemporary artist known for his paradoxical sculptures including the Fat Car series, One Minute Sculptures, and Narrow House, which overturns the classic perception of reality (until March 9; Karlsplatz 5; albertina.at).

In 2025, Vienna celebrates the 200th anniversary of the birth of Johann Strauss with a rich yearlong programme of events at indoor and outdoor locations in all 23 districts of Vienna (until December 31; johannstrauss2025.at). If Strauss had lived today, he would have been a massive pop star, just as he was in the 19th century. The composer of the famous Die Fledermaus operetta and the iconic The Blue Danube waltz wrote hundreds of musical pieces and is rightfully considered the King of Waltz. A major Strauss exhibition is on show at the Theatermuseum until June 23, and the composer's apartment on Praterstraße is also worth a visit. Performances in January include Valse, Valse, Valse at Dschungel Wien, in which choreographer Johanna Heusser explores the rebellious nature of the waltz (January 5 - April 8). The Viennese Night of Dance ball takes place at the Wiener Konzerthaus on January II. while the 'Tritsch Tratsch' concert on January 27 - also at the Wiener Konzerthaus remixes 19 timeless hits by Strauss.

The Imperial Riding School is one of the key landmarks of classic Vienna. Now guests can enjoy the unique opportunity of staying overnight in this historic location, which has been transformed into a hotel (Ungargasse 60; marriott.com; from EUR 170). The site served as a military equestrian school during the reign of Emperor Franz Joseph I, while later it was repurposed as a movie theatre and a garage for postal buses. The hotel's 342 rooms have been designed by Goddard Littlefair, BWM Designers & Architects, and Lindle+Bukor. The lobby, with its wood flooring and monumental columns, pays tribute to the site's past as a stable. The Farrier bar offers a classy repose in an artistic atmosphere, while the Elstar Restaurant decorated in Secessionist-style mirrored panels features an orchard-like garden and an innovative take on Viennese cuisine.

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

From Montmartre to Montparnasse: Catalan Artists in Paris, 1889-1914 explores the bohemian world of early-20th-century Paris (until March 30; Carrer de Montcada, 15-23; museupicassobcn.cat). The banks of the Seine River with their two artistic epicentres – Montmartre in the late 19th century and Montparnasse in the early 20th century - serve as geographical counterpoints in this showcase alongside the Ile de la Cité, Belleville, and the Canal de Saint Martin. The show's 256 paintings, drawings, lithographs, sculptures, books, and other publications by nearly 80 Catalan artists, including Pablo Picasso, present a unique testament of the urban and human landscapes of the French capital. This multidisciplinary exhibition covers the era between two major historical events: the Exposition Universelle world's fair of 1889 and the beginning of the First World War.

The new Miiro Borneta hotel is nestled in the vibrant El Born district and features a spectacular rooftop terrace overlooking the city (Passeig de Picasso, 26, 30; miirohotels.com; from EUR 190). The area, which used to be an old neighbourhood of artisans, is now home to an avantgarde community of artists, boutiques, and tapas bars. The hotel features 92 rooms and suites dressed in soft hues. Many rooms also have an outdoor terrace or balcony. The communal zones pay homage to Spanish design and local art, attracting guests with lively settings in which a modern fusion of culture and decor meets elegance and comfort. The on-site openkitchen Volta Restaurant & Bar serves delicious Mediterranean dishes and owes its name to a low vaulted brickwork ceiling typical of Catalan architecture as well as the famous arches of the Porxos de Fontseré overhead.

The Australian skincare brand *Aesop* stands out with its site-specific boutique interiors. The thoughtful design of its new outpost in Barcelona, called Aesop Diagonal, was created by the team at Mesura and is rooted in identity and sustainability, timelessness and locality (Avinguda Diagonal 594; aesop.com). The scenography of the single-room space centres on reused Montjuïc stone in the form of remnants of demolished buildings found stored in an old quarry. Against a backdrop of light stucco walls, the raw composition of 78 stones boldly embodies fragments of Barcelona memories: its 19th-century buildings, structures from the Gothic Quarter, ancient fountains, archways, and pedestals. With their distinctive reddish, beige, and grey tones, they represent the city's architectural identity.

Zurich's cabaret delights

This influential movement was born in 1916 at the iconic Cabaret Voltaire nightclub. Today, Cabaret Voltaire continues to thrive as a museum, bar, and café, paying homage to its avantgarde roots. In its early days, the club was much more than a mere performance space; it served as a sanctuary for Dadaists, fostering experimentation with innovative forms of expression that blended spoken word, music, and dance.

The city was also a home of Swiss, or German, *Kabarett* – a form of French cabaret that began in the early 20th century and centred on political satire and gallows humour. This performing art often featured acrobats, stand-up comics, actors, illusionists, juggling, pantomime, poetry, exotic musicians, and even animals. On top of that, *Le Chat Noir* inspired adding a generous pinch of political satire seasoned with cynicism, sarcasm, and irony.

Today, Switzerland's largest city continues to honour its cultural heritage, offering a wide range of cabaret experiences for locals and visitors alike. From cabaret musicals and burlesque to comedy and even travelling Swiss cabaret buses, Zurich's vibrant scene has something for everyone.

The Bernhard Theatre transforms into the Kit Kat Club to stage the iconic *Cabaret* musical, immersing audiences in the unique ambience of the 1920s. For a more intimate experience, Pink Rabbit, tucked behind a secret entrance near Paradeplatz, delivers unforgettable performances, while The Millers theatre hosts cabaret, vaudeville, and familyfriendly musicals in a cosy setting.

To experience the soul of cabaret, visit Herzbaracke, a floating theatre steeped in tradition. Built over 20 years ago and adorned in the opulent style of La Belle Époque, Herzbaracke drifts seasonally on Lake Zurich. Here, every detail, from the meticulously chosen decor to the warm hospitality, invites guests into a magical world of cabaret, variety, and enchanting performances.

SOLOMONE winery has a capacity of 35 000 bottles. Our vineyards cover 3 hectares, with vines aged between 15 and 8 years. We exclusively work with Imeretian grape varieties - Tsitska, Tsolikouri, Krakhuna, Dzelshavi, - to produce high-quality wine, showcasing that Chiatura can excel in winemaking beyond manganese production."

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


MY FAVOURITE PLACE / January

Spitalfields Market

Dive into Dubai's beach culture

The city by the sea offers year-round sunshine and a vibrant coastal culture like no other.

Winter is the perfect season for swimming and outdoor relaxation in Dubai. While locals may find the water a bit chilly for their taste, the Arabian Gulf provides a warm escape for Europeans seeking relief from winter.

Public beaches are the most accessible option, offering free entry along with amenities such as showers, changing rooms, and restrooms. If you want to rent a sunbed, it will cost you around AED 100 (approximately EUR 26). However, the beaches can get crowded, especially on weekends.

One of the beaches that are open to the public is Kite Beach, which is a local favourite and you guessed it – popular with kitesurfers. The colourful kites often dot the Dubai skyline. The beach offers free changing rooms, and the showers are also free of charge. An array of food trucks and cafés are available along the shore, serving sandwiches, salads, and snacks and making this a great spot for an active day out.

JBR Beach near the Dubai Marina is a familyfriendly destination with plenty of activities, including water sports, and a lively promenade lined with shops and restaurants. Entry is free, with sunbeds available for rent. However, some parts of the beach are reserved for hotel guests or require an access fee.

La Mer is another excellent beach that offers essential amenities free of charge. There are also a variety of cafés and restaurants to grab a bite if you feel hungry. Like most beaches in Dubai, it closes at sunset. But for those interested in night swimming, the city has recently enhanced its tourism offerings by installing lighting and safety measures at three beaches: Jumeirah 2, Jumeirah 3, and Umm Sugeim l.

Expats love spending time at the beach, while Emiratis prefer more private options, such as pools at luxury hotels or their own villas. There's no specific sunbathing etiquette in Dubai, and wearing a bikini is generally acceptable on beaches. However, going topless is strictly prohibited.

For a more private experience, beach clubs whether part of luxury hotels or standalone offer exclusivity, though access usually requires a fee or a hotel stay. Entry grants access to facilities and sometimes dining options as well. You can definitely find a club that suits your style, whether you're looking for something family-friendly, romantic, or party-oriented with DJs performing live.



STOP BY

Maison de la Plage Opened just about a year ago, this beach club is one of the most captivating spots on Palm Jumeirah. With its colourful interiors. vibrant ambience, and live music, it exudes the charm of the French Riviera. The beach restaurant serves simple yet flavourful dishes complemented by a pool and private beach access. Guests can enjoy stunning views of the Dubai Marina and the Bluewaters neighbourhood, which is home to the world's tallest observation wheel, standing at a height of 250 metres. maisondelaplage.com

Nikki Beach This beach club is truly one of a kind, featuring a stunning, Maldives-like azure sea that's unmatched in Dubai. Following a major renovation, Nikki Beach now boasts a boho-chic vibe with lively party zones, including a DJ set by the pool, and peaceful spots for sunbathing on the beach. The restaurant, which has floor-toceiling glass doors, offers Mediterranean cuisine. 
My secret spot

Take your friends ...ON A TAPAS TOUR OF MALAGA

The streets of Malaga hum with life. Locals chat over glasses of wine, the aroma of sizzling dishes drifts through the air, and laughter spills from bars at every corner.





Sharing tapas here is best done with friends, as you connect not only with one another but with the city's past, its rich cultures, and its ancient civilisations. So, rally your crew and head out on a tapas tour through Malaga, tasting the city's history one bite at a time.

Start where Malaga's story began as Malaka, a bustling Phoenician port where seafood reigned supreme. At Casa Lola, order the boquerones en vinagre, which are anchovies marinated in vinegar, olive oil, and garlic. This bright, tangy dish captures the city's deep connection to the sea. Pair it with a glass of Malaga's sweet wine to kick off your evening on the perfect note.

Next, step into Malaga's Roman past with a visit to *El Pimpi*, a buzzy tapas bar brimming with Andalusian charm. The Romans introduced garum, a prized fermented fish sauce, and exported it widely across their empire. While the sauce itself is lost to time, its influence lives on in marinated tuna and salted fish, both of which are must-tries at this Malaga institution.

Next, make your way to Los Marangós for a taste of Malaga's Moorish heritage. The Moors brought bold spices and sweet-savoury pairings to Andalusia, beautifully expressed in *berenjenas con miel* – crispy fried eggplant drizzled with golden cane honey. The Moors ruled here until the Christian reconquest of Spain brought pork to the forefront of Malaga's cuisine. Soon, jamón ibérico became one of the region's most beloved delicacies. Head to Mesón Ibérico to taste Spain's legendary cured ham, with its buttery, melt-inyour-mouth texture.

Wrap up your tapas tour at *Beluga* in the heart of Plaza de las Flores, where the city's culinary traditions meet modern innovation. Dishes such as ceviche scallops and oxtail fritters with foie gras reimagine local ingredients, offering a creative twist on Malaga's rich culinary history. They're a perfect finale to your tapas tour.



Shakespeare reimagined

London's new Museum of Shakespeare will blend 16th-century treasures with immersive storytelling.

In the heart of the Shoreditch area of London, The Stage, a vibrant mixeduse development area designed by *Perkins&Will*, has transformed a onceisolated site into a bustling urban hub. With pedestrian-friendly routes, a park, a restored Victorian railway viaduct turned into a play zone, and a mix of offices, apartments, shops, and restaurants, it's a destination brimming with energy.


But the real treasure lies beneath. During construction, archaeologists uncovered the remains of the Curtain Playhouse, a 16th-century theatre where William Shakespeare's troupe performed before moving to the iconic Globe Theatre. Opened in 1577, this historic venue is believed to have premiered *Henry V* and hosted performances of *Romeo & Juliet* and other plays by The Bard. Notably, its rectangular stage diverged from the circular norm, a feature that now inspires the site's architecture.

Today, a subterranean museum preserves the Curtain Playhouse's legacy. Built three metres underground to align with the theatre's original footprint, the museum is topped with a sleek glass-and-steel structure. Visitors can stroll along raised glass walkways and platforms, standing at the height of the original stage, and gaze down at the remarkable ruins of this theatrical landmark.

The museum's exterior integrates well with its surroundings, featuring steps that form an outdoor amphitheatre merging into the piazza. Its stainlesssteel façade mimics the folds of stage curtains, while a striking bird-shaped cutout on the northern side offers a unique view of the area. This feature is a nod to a ceramic bird whistle unearthed during excavations, which is believed to have been used for sound effects in *Romeo & Juliet* performances centuries ago.

Though the building is complete, the official opening is set for later this year. Inside, an immersive exhibition designed by the *Bompas & Parr* creative studio promises a journey back to 1598, using cutting-edge multisensory theatrical technology to bring Shakespeare's world vividly to life. thestageshoreditch.com * *airBaltic* flies to London from Riga and Tallinn. 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
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Sweet escapes



AMSTERDAM'S **CULTURAL SPREAD**

Amsterdam doesn't need an introduction. Either you love it, or you've visited on a dreary-weather day – of which, let's face it, there are plenty. That's why, when one of those rare sunny and exceptionally warm winter days arrives, Amsterdammers appreciate it like no one else. Today is just such a day, and I'm setting off on a trip locals

love to take on days like this – a ferry ride across the IJ River to the northern part of the city. It's often described in travel guides as the 'edgiest' area of Amsterdam, which is often code for slightly shady. That may have been true of Noord a decade ago, but things have changed. Take NDSM, for example. The former shipyard is now home to Europe's biggest flea market and some of the city's grandest dance music events, such as DGTL, a festival held every spring. There are plenty more reasons to visit Noord, most of them decidedly hedonistic. After all, there's a reason for the saying Noord gestoord, which translates loosely to 'this is where the party's really at'.

Go east, and you'll find a cluster of venues along Gedempt Hamerkanaal: sophisticated tacos at Coba, the semi-barsemi-club vibe of Benelux Bar, out-of-the-ordinary pizza at Europizza, the Chateau Amsterdam urban winery, craft beers at Oedipus Brewing, and the Barracuda seafood restaurant, where families and robot food runners mingle with weary partygoers from nearby hotspots such as Garage Noord. Nightlife here isn't just entertainment – it's woven into the fabric of the city's culture. In fact, the denacht.amsterdam platform, launched by nightclubs such as Garage Noord, Kanaal40, and Radio Radio, is one of the standout features of Amsterdam's 750th anniversary year, with events filling the city from dusk till dawn until the milestone date of October 27. On any given weekend, Amsterdam buzzes with events featuring world-class DJs. It's a nightlife offer that's perhaps second only to Berlin. Other benchmark anniversary events include the grand Happy Birthday Amsterdam exhibition at the H'art Museum featuring works by 75 artists who have at some point called Amsterdam their home, from Karel Appel to Marlene Dumas. Another highlight is the '24 Hours' event series, during which a single district in the city is spotlighted for 24 hours. During 'its day', the district is filled with a multitude of free happenings tours, workshops, exhibits - to shine a light on the uniqueness of

each neighbourhood.

On June 21, the celebration will take a bold turn as the Ring AlO motorway encircling Amsterdam will close to cars, making way for dancing, sports, and theatre. In total, over 300 activities are planned throughout the year to celebrate the city's 750th birthday. In addition, the anniversary aims to leave a lasting legacy, as 750 trees will be planted across the city and five unique art installations will be set up in less central, more up-and-coming neighbourhoods.

NOORD HAS A SOFT SIDE, TOO - THE KIND YOU'D WANT TO BRING YOUR PARENTS TO. It's a place where traditional wooden houses line the Buiksloterdijk, Schellingwouderdijk, and Nieuwendammerdijk dikes, all oozing with cinematic charm. But today, I'm heading to another spot that fully embodies Noord's DIY spirit: the Papaverweg area, where some of the locals' favourite haunts have breathed new ultra-cool life into industrial buildings.

Take Zomer Bar, for instance – a makeshift bar run by the Sebonsa natural wine importers. A playful nod to the French expression 'C'est bon ça', Sebonsa was born during a trip taken by three friends – Duchein Kuil, Yoeri Wegman, and Justin Grooten - to Switzerland for a natural wine fair. They returned with 60 bottles from winemaker Jean-Christophe Piccard and a mission to bring that convivial energy to Amsterdam.

Occupying a hangar-like shed that used to be a dance school, this pop-up bar opened last summer and became such a beloved hangout for snazzy locals that it extended its run through the winter. But now in January, Sebonsa is migrating to a café at Hoofdweg 141 in Amsterdam-West to launch yet another sixmonth pop-up, at which its wines will be paired with elevated comfort food by young chef Ciaran Patrick.

A few moments later, I find myself next door, surrounded by couples, father-daughter duos, and sharply dressed groups of friends finishing off plates at Cosmo Tacos, a recent pop-up that kept appearing on my Instagram feed. 'We're trying to find a permanent location,' says Bob Nagel, the force behind Cosmo Tacos and five other restaurants as well as three bakeries under the name of Binnenvisser - yet another venture born from a passion for natural wine.

Back in 2018, when Nagel and his partner Maarten Bloem launched Binnenvisser, a wine bar serving sharing plates from a menu that changes weekly, it was one of the first spots in the city to focus on natural wine. Nagel was 26 and Bloem was 27 when they took over a drab 'brown bar' next to Bilderdijkpark, and, as with most of their ventures, they handled the renovations themselves. I gasp when Nagel reveals that the beautiful, ornate stained-glass windows that give Binnenvisser its distinctive serenity were once covered up.

Nagel and Bloem have a knack for predicting Amsterdam's next big food trend. While the pandemic played hot and cold with the hospitality scene, the duo delivered several new addresses to Amsterdam's food map. Inspired by the listening bars they discovered during a trip to Japan in 2021, they opened Cornerstore in Noord. But it's not exactly a listening bar. 'With such labels come certain expectations,' Nagel explains. What you can expect from Cornerstore, however, is East Asianinspired dishes served under stunning lighting, accompanied by a sound system that would make any audiophile's eves twinkle.

Meanwhile, back in the city centre, they launched Café Twee Prinsen, a tiny canal-side bar that's perfect for after-dinner



drinks. Relaxed sipping, people-watching, and small bites define

Slightly less famous, though equally deserving of attention, this spot. And the crowd? Eclectic. 'You can have a couple is Lindengrachtmarkt just one block over. Speaking of the internet, Amsterdam's bakeries are getting a lot of online love. The bakery scene is booming, with new spots opening so quickly that local foodies are constantly logging new entries into Google Maps. Croissant emojis the way the cool kids log entries on maps these days - are multiplying particularly quickly in Amsterdam-West. If Noord is where you go to blow off steam, then West is where you

and raspberry croissants. Its ever-changing treats frequently go viral, and - unlike so many Instagram sensations -Salvo's creations truly live up to the hype.

Go further west, and you'll arrive at Fort Negen. Everything on its turquoise-tiled display is impeccably elegant and technically flawless. From perfectly shaped cinnamon buns to cruffins bursting with seasonal curds that avoid being overly sweet. This summer, the bakery also opened a sandwich shop next door, elevating the humble Dutch lunchtime staple to artisanal levels.

Competing with Fort Negen for the title of best almond croissant is *Ulmus Bakery*, just a short walk away. A neighbourhood gem with a tiny seating area, it offers a front-row view of the baking process, with sacks of flour stacked in plain sight and blisteringly hot buns regularly emerging from the oven. To visit and not order its famed almond croissant, which is filled with heavenly almond cream and generously sprinkled with almond shavings and powdered sugar, would be a mistake.

But today, I'm heading to Farine, a French sourdough bakery and café that opened in December in the Bos en Lommer neighbourhood, affectionately referred to by locals as Bolo. With its large chequered windows, the bakery welcomes me with an unexpected sense of space and airiness - not the snug confines you'd typically expect from a bakery - followed swiftly by a soft, buttery aroma. Farine

is the passion project of three apprentices: Mitchel Charles, an Englishman; Mark Verweij, a Dutchman; and Thomas Vieux-Pernon, who's French. 'There's got to be a joke in there somewhere,' Charles laughs as he ushers me to the upstairs seating area, which offers a lovely overview of the space, decorated with thrifted finds from Marktplaats, an online marketplace.

Why Bolo, I ask? First of all, most of the team lives nearby. 'The area was missing a community-driven bakery that invites people to come, sit, and relax,' Charles explains. Plus, he sees the neighbourhood as up-and-coming in the next few years, driven by the addition of new residential complexes. A trained chef who previously worked in Amsterdam's coffee parlours, Charles ensures Farine delivers on its coffee as well. The menu leans towards French boulangerie with a twist - think kimchi-brie croissants. While I'm there, several customers inquire about the lemon tart a local foodie influencer recently raved about. 'That's Clara's work,' Charles says, referring to their pastry chef. 'She's incredibly talented.'

After savouring a *pain au chocolat* with a heavenly, intensely flavoured chocolate filling, I snag a freshly baked baguette on my way out. Using your phone while cycling might not be allowed, but munching on a baguette is perfectly fine. It's absolutely bonkers what locals here do on their bikes, from transporting another bike to balancing an entire Ikea Billy bookcase. There's even a famous dog walker who cycles through Vondelpark with around 20 dogs, which is quite a spectacle to behold. Bicycling in Amsterdam may seem intimidating at first, and I dare you to try it. Locals might seem like they're rushing, but as long as you stay to the side so they can pass, you'll be fine. Plus, everyone's surprisingly supportive. If I had a cent for every time someone picked up the hat that the wind yanked off my head, I could buy a *biertje* (a little beer).

These new-generation bakeries also serve expertly made lattes. But if you're after a serious caffeine fix, stay put. Just next door to Farine are the coffee mavericks of Friedhats Fuku Café. Fuku, meaning 'good fortune' in Japanese, is an award-winning micro roastery known for its trippy, cartoonish branding. Its coffee doesn't just fuel casual gossip - it delivers a 'let's brainstorm some business ideas' buzz.

While Amsterdam may have contributed to the global matcha shortage, its coffee culture is thriving, too, with coffee emojis also steadily multiplying on maps. Local coffee aficionados were thrilled when Dak Coffee Roasters opened its first permanent

location, a sleek showroom in the Oud-West neighbourhood. Founded by Montrealers Veronique Lagarde and Louis-Philippe Boucher, Dak began roasting beans in Noord five years ago and, despite not having a fixed location, quickly earned a loyal following. Delicate and minimalist, the showroom's design reflects the ethereal quality of its nuanced brews. Each coffee cup comes with a 'passport' detailing the bean's processing method, varietal, origin, and even the barista's name. I try 'Darling Peach' made from Ethiopian cherries using anaerobic processing, and I never imagined how many layers of flavour a single cup of coffee could contain.

PROPERLY CAFFEINATED, IT'S TIME FOR SOME

CULTURAL EXPLORATION. So, I head down to Museumplein. Amsterdammers are spoiled when it comes to world-class art venues. The Rijksmuseum's grandeur and its collection of works by Old Masters remain timeless, but it's the Stedelijk Museum that keeps locals coming back, thanks to its zeitgeist-defining exhibits of contemporary icons such as Nan Goldin and Marina Abramović. This year, one of the highlights is a major exhibition of work by Anselm Kiefer, one of the most significant German artists of our time. For the first time, Stedelijk is teaming up with the nearby Van Gogh Museum to showcase Kiefer's work, including some never-before-seen pieces.

Stedelijk knows how to stage a show. On my last visit, I visited the exhibition Unravel: The Power and Politics of Textiles *in Art* (on display until January 5) – who knew I could ever be so captivated by textile art? I can only imagine the scale and grandeur with which Kiefer's monumental canvases will be presented. Alongside its coveted permanent collection, which spans era-defining works from 1880 to the present and featuring names such as Mark Rothko, Yayoi Kusama, and Steve McQueen, the Stedelijk continues to raise the bar.

In November, the museum also finally gained the café it deserves: Fonda, which is perched on the second floor by the majestic marble staircase. This sharp luncheonette invites customers to rest on chairs designed by renowned Dutch designer Sabine Marcelis and indulge in plates that are far from the typical museum canteen fare. Think oyster mushrooms with fried egg, crispy potatoes, and fermented chillies, or a French omelette with endive wedges and toast. Each dish is presented with the elegance of a work of art and is complemented by an impressive selection of Japanese teas.

Amsterdam also excels in smaller art venues, especially along the Keizersgracht. Two favourites, both focused on photography, sit on its historic banks. Tucked inside a breathtaking 17th-century canalside house, Huis Marseille is Amsterdam's first photography museum, showcasing artists who push the boundaries of the medium and challenge today's status quo. Its opulent interior – complete with painted ceilings, stucco work, marble, and a red period room in the Louis XIV style creates a dialogue with the exhibited art. This is no sterile white cube; most exhibitions at Huis Marseille are developed and produced specifically for these unique spaces. Its poetic courtyard is the perfect finale to any visit, no matter the season.

Further down the street stands Foam, a cornerstone of the global photography scene. Balancing world-renowned photographers with a spotlight on local talent, Foam's current exhibits include Sarah Amrani's thought-provoking exploration of the impact of AI and social media on beauty standards, and Koos Breukel's iconic portraits, which opens on January 17. Foam's show openings are one of the rare occasions - aside from weekend pastries - when you'll find Amsterdammers eagerly queuing. The museum provides plenty of fodder for conversation over dinner, and its location is perfectly positioned for my destination this evening - I've bagged a hot-ticket table at Cue.

FINE DINING ISN'T TYPICALLY THE FIRST THING THAT COMES TO MIND WHEN YOU THINK OF FOOD IN AMSTERDAM, BUT THINGS ARE CHANGING, thanks in part to talented foreign chefs who've made the Dutch capital their home.

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
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If you ever feel you're running out of reasons to visit the Dutch capital, don't worry – this city never rests

Opened in early December, Cue is a fine-dining restaurant paired with a listening bar. It's helmed and co-owned by Greek chef George Kataras and Algerian-French sommelier Mohamed Aous, a dynamic duo who earned Vanderveen a Michelin star in 2023.

Cue begins with a wood-accented open kitchen, where the team, dressed in crisp white button-ups, greets guests and works in full view. From there, the setup transitions into an intimate dining area that seats just 32 guests. Initially, the team scouted for a venue to establish a fine-dining spot, but stumbling upon this house on bustling Utrechtsestraat inspired them to weave in Kataras and Aous' shared passion for vinyl, explains Steven Macleod, one of Cue's co-founders. Macleod, who also co-owns Alba, a wine bar in the Amsterdam-Oost district, had previously collaborated with Kataras as a consulting chef, a partnership that earned *Alba* a *Michelin* Bib Gourmand title last year.

Having a little time before my table is ready, I head to the listening bar downstairs. The understated elegance of upstairs transitions into a plusher, more opulent atmosphere. My negroni – infused with peach and pear wine and plum sake, in a clever twist - arrives accompanied with a small note explaining its concept: 'high-quality audio and quiet conversation'. The bar exudes a retro-modern vibe with a touch of eccentricity. The centrepiece, a DJ booth inspired

by 1950s Japanese audio bars, is guarded by the striking figure of a cheetah – a setup that instinctively makes you reach for your phone camera. But the design isn't just about aesthetics; it's purpose-driven. With Kataras' background in music engineering, elements such as the ceiling, which is covered in small holes and features a 3D-printed mathematical equation. are designed to optimise acoustics. The listening bar strives to nurture Amsterdam's vinyl community, where almost anyone can step in as a selector, sharing their personal collection of records. It's easy to lose track of time here, but Cue operates as a seamless whole: my bartender informs me my table upstairs is ready.

The kitchen is inspired by pre-industrial cooking, yet the dishes are executed with modern sophistication. It's hard to highlight a crown jewel in the nine-course set menu. Each dish - presented on stunning bespoke tableware - feels like a standalone performance, yet they all come together as a symphony. Even the sourdough bread, made with dark beer and paired with heavenly salty hibiscus butter, had my dinner date and me sparring over the last piece: 'No, you take it.'

The sommelier's pairings, perfectly attuned to each dish, elevate the experience even further. 'Who's going to propose to whom?' I laugh with my dinner partner. It's the kind of meal befitting a grand gesture. Yet, isn't the simple fact of being alive and well and in Amsterdam worth celebrating on its own?

And if you ever feel you're running out of reasons to visit the Dutch capital, don't worry - this city never rests. With the new luxe Rosewood Hotel opening in the former Palace of Justice this spring and the Drift Museum soon after, Amsterdam continues to evolve. Just a few parting tips for a smoother experience: look twice when crossing streets (first for bicycles, then for cars), don't forget to tap your card when leaving public transport, and ignore the weather apps - just pack a raincoat.

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Which food and drink spots in Amsterdam would you recommend?

To start the day, I'd go to Mundi in Amsterdam-West for coffee and a small breakfast. I often meet friends there, especially when the sun is out. For lunch, I like to go to *The Lebanese Sajeria* – its lamb and tarator manousheh is amazing. If you're on *Instagram* for updates on in the mood for a traditional Dutch lunch, I recommend *Eetsalon Van Dobben*. In addition to its famous 'kroket', it also offers a wide variety of sandwiches. The old-school interior and atmosphere make the experience even better. For dessert, Miuz Gelato near Vondelpark, which serves the best gelato in Amsterdam, is worth going to even in winter. Try the salted caramel flavour!

If I'm celebrating or want to treat friends to my favourite food, I take them to Watergang. It offers a French-Italian inspired five-course meal that changes every month and can be adjusted for vegetarians and pescatarians. I find a reason to head there at least once every two months.

Where's the best place to dance the night away in Amsterdam? My favourite place to dance right now is *Club Raum* in the West, which opened last

Born in Enschede and calling Amsterdam home for more than 15 years, **Tsepo** is a Dutch DJ who's a staple of Amsterdam's nightlife. year. It's a beautiful space with a lovely sound system. Another noteworthy spot is Breakfast Club, a party series that feels like my second home. The concept there is that you start with a breakfast and then dance the day away. It's celebrating its 15th anniversary this year, so keep an eye out upcoming events.

How would you spend a perfect winter day in Amsterdam? I'd escape the busy city by taking a walk in Amsterdamse Bos or Het Twiske, which is a recreational area a bit outside the city. They're both easily reachable with a bicycle. If the weather is rainy, I'd grab some food at *Kokkita*. It's a simple takeaway spot in Amsterdam-Zuid that offers some of the best Indonesian food in Amsterdam. Sundays are especially busy, but it's definitely worth joining the queue.

What's a common misconception about Amsterdam that you'd like to debunk?

Are there any misconceptions? Almost everyone here rides a bicycle, it rains quite often, and most Dutch people celebrate family birthdays by sitting in a circle in the living room. It's all true.

FROM SELF-TAUGHT CHEF TO A MICHELIN STAR

From humble beginnings and a self-taught culinary journey, Kristaps Sīlis has become one of Latvia's most celebrated chefs. In an interview with Baltic Outlook, he shares his passion for modern Latvian cuisine and his drive to create innovative dining experiences.

Stubborn, ambitious, a workaholic, and a visionary these are just a few of the words that come to mind after more than two hours of conversation with chef Kristaps Sīlis. He is only the second Latvian chef to have his restaurant awarded a prestigious Michelin star. To the surprise of Sīlis himself and many others, this recognition came just three months after the opening of John Chef's Hall.

'I've never had such a good year. It wasn't even planned. So many great things have happened that have changed my life,' he says of the past year, which has seen him fulfil his dream of opening a truly special restaurant, receive a Michelin star, and welcome his youngest daughter into the world. Although Sīlis' name has long been known in the Riga restaurant scene, and the current owner of John Chef's Hall approached him after experiencing his cooking, the past few years have been filled with challenges. The pandemic affected restaurant attendance across the board, and Silis' ambitions didn't always align with the resources and business strategies of restaurant owners. As a result, Sīlis has managed several different restaurants in recent years, always seeking opportunities to remain true to himself. He is also committed to advancing modern Latvian cuisine and restaurant culture. Sīlis is one of the founders of the Young Chefs Movement in Latvia, and he believes it is crucial to support Latvian fishermen, farmers, and breeders by helping their products make their way into restaurants.

He continues to do so at his Michelin-starred restaurant. 'I believe a restaurant should be an exciting experience, and that's what John Chef's Hall offers. It's like theatre or opera - an emotional journey for the diner, not just a place to eat. It's also rooted in Latvian ingredients. That's why it's so special to me,' says the chef.

Sīlis and his entire team were surprised when. within days of the Michelin star announcement, the restaurant was fully booked for the next three months. John Chef's Hall has only a few tables and no menu, as the chef controls the selection each night. Sīlis himself serves guests and tells the stories behind each dish. The cuisine is modern and occasionally playful, but it's always focused on preserving flavour. Every ingredient is treated with equal respect and care. He also emphasises a focus on a few key ingredients that are introduced in different ways throughout the meal. His aim is to

make guests feel as if they're dining at his home. That's why he personally draws the design for each plate, chooses the colours, and insists that they're made to his exact specifications.

Sīlis oversees not only John Chef's Hall but also John, a restaurant in the same building. Named after John F. Kennedy, the restaurant is linked to a historic visit. In 1939, when the United States embassy in Riga was located in this same building on Ausekla iela in Riga, a young Kennedy, who later became one of the most important presidents in US history, stayed in the house on a summer tour of Europe. John has also earned a place in the Michelin Guide's recommendations.

I'm not willing to compromise, even in day-to-day life

I know you spent several months setting up John Chef's Hall alone, including designing the plates. Why can't you just pick the china for your restaurant from a beautiful design catalogue? I'm an idealist, and it's important for me to have things exactly the way I envision them. I'm not willing to compromise, even in day-to-day life. I never take the easy route - I always choose the more challenging path if I believe it will lead to a better result. Sure, I could go to a large store and buy plates that are also being used in 25 other places, but for me, it was crucial to create a unique story. Every detail, including the tableware, needs to align with that vision and be part of the experience I want to offer.

What was your reaction when you heard that your restaurant had been awarded a Michelin star? I didn't understand what was going on. My phone was flooded with congratulations, because the news had already spread in the morning before the official announcement that evening. For me, *Michelin* is the greatest recognition in the world. I couldn't believe it.

The first surprise came last year, when Michelin came to Latvia. I didn't think it would happen in my lifetime, especially as Latvia is a relatively small country. Of course, I never imagined that John Chef's Hall would get a star, especially since it had just opened. However, we did have a feeling that we might be included in Michelin's recommendations, because some time before the results were announced they had asked us for information to create a restaurant profile.

You've said that you owe your success to hard work rather than talent.

I'm absolutely convinced of that. I think talent is something you're born with, something that comes effortlessly. Nothing has ever come easy for me. Everything I've achieved in the culinary world has been through hard work and relentless learning. However, I also have talents in other areas. For example, I'm quick to understand how things work. I often repair my own car and motorcycle, even though I've never studied mechanics.

Do you see parallels between your practical talents and your work in the kitchen?

Most people work an eight-hour day, but I've often worked 16- and even 20-hour days. I still sometimes get home late at night, only to dive in again the next morning. For me, this relentless drive is what lies behind the success of the restaurant. I've always felt that sleep is almost a waste of time - I'd give it up if I could.

But don't you ever need inspiration, like spending time in nature or with your family? Life cannot be all work.

Absolutely, but life is so dynamic that it can be a challenge to find time for everything. My special time is the hour-and-a-half drive to work and back, as I live outside of Riga. That's when I let my thoughts flow and jot down ideas as they come.

Listening to loud music in the car - usually hiphop, and especially tracks from my childhood, such as Eminem - is where I often find my inspiration. It's not about actively listening, but just having the music as a loud background. It fuels my creativity without distracting me. Interestingly, I can even fall asleep to loud music. I thrive in chaos, but I'm incredibly calm in it. I'm an emotional person, but my emotions are internal. My mind is always buzzing with ideas for the future, and when the moment is right, I bring them to life.

What have you and your family sacrificed to achieve success?

I wouldn't call it a sacrifice. My family can't imagine life any other way. But I worry that one day, when I finally stop, I'll realise that I could have done more for my family, for Latvia, for myself. I also believe that everyone needs to realise their potential and feel fulfilled.

I have three children, including a newborn daughter, and it's true that my family sees less of me because of my work. To compensate, I've made Sundays strictly family days, dedicated to spending time with my children. Mondays, which are also a bit quieter, are for my wife while the kids are at school. On Tuesdays, I'm completely immersed in work again. Mornings are short - maybe I make breakfast - and I'm not home until late in the evening, sometimes around ll p.m. There are no family dinners on those days. When my youngest daughter was born, I took a week off, and that was a rare break for me.

Is being a chef a lonely profession?

When I became a head chef at about age 20, I lost a lot of my friends and all my free time. I didn't have the luxury of partying or socialising. But I've spoken with others in the industry, and many have had the same experience. I'm a bit of a loner by nature; I find it hard to be around too many people or handle

too much attention. That's actually why I agreed to appear on a TV show - I was struggling with public speaking and wanted to challenge myself to learn new skills

I like to compare friendships with rocket launches - how the engines help the rocket take off, but eventually they separate and each goes into its own orbit. You spend a certain amount of time together, and then you move on. New people come into your life, people whose interests coincide with yours at that moment.

Have you had any mentors?

I've had a couple of chefs stay with me for a few months, and I did an internship at the famous Noma restaurant in Copenhagen around 2013. There I learned more about the order and system of a large restaurant by observing. At Noma, there were about 50 chefs in the kitchen at any one time, 30 of whom were interns - a mix of students and professional chefs at different levels. We worked unpaid, paid for our own travel and accommodation, and took time off from our regular jobs to do it. I was already a head chef in Riga at the time.

One day, for example, I had to cut the stems out of 20 kilograms of sorrel leaves. It was simple, repetitive *YouTube*, perhaps?

work, and I spent six to eight hours doing it. The more skilled interns were assigned to cleaning crabs and scallops. At first, of course, I was given the task of food preparation, but eventually I was allowed to work in the kitchen itself, learning by observation. I saw general cleaning taking place three times a day, team meetings, and how the food labs worked. Experiencing all this first-hand was incredible.


But to be honest, I'm mostly self-taught. It's both a blessing and a curse. The blessing is that I haven't copied anyone. The downside is that if I had been formally trained, I might have picked things up a bit quicker. But this process has allowed me to dive deep into the nuances and experiment, rather than just blindly follow instructions. For example, if someone had told me 'this is the only way to cook fish', I would have done it that way all my life, never thinking that there might be a better, more efficient, or faster way. I train myself every day to get better, and I've succeeded. I've done every step myself, from cleaning the fish to cooking and plating. This hands-on experience has been invaluable.

But you must have learned the basics somewhere cookery school, French cookbooks, or

When I started working professionally, I was quickly put in the role of head chef, and I had to learn on my own. Back then, there weren't as many resources available. I couldn't afford good cookbooks, and social media wasn't as developed as it is now. What did I do? I bought fish with my own salary and came to work early in the morning, before the other chefs arrived, to practise in private. It was important to me to not show my mistakes but to demonstrate what I had mastered. I'd come in when no one else was around and just try... step by step.

To be honest, I learned very little at cookery school. It wasn't my priority, and I didn't attend much. I enrolled because I followed some friends who were there studying other professions, and I thought, 'Why not try cooking?'

I had never cooked before, and there were no professional chefs in my family. At that time, in the countryside where I grew up, food was simple and unappealing to me. I had never been to a proper

restaurant. By the time I left school, I didn't even know how to chop properly, let alone do anything advanced. I didn't enjoy cooking at all, and I was convinced I wouldn't become a chef. My goal was just to finish school and get a diploma. My father was a builder and I had planned to follow in his footsteps, having worked in construction while at school.

What changed? How did you fall in love with cooking and restaurants?

The turning point came when I did my internship at a real place in Latvia – at the Dikli Palace restaurant, where the young, talented chef Valters Zirdziņš was in charge. I only spent a few months there, but it changed everything. There was thyme, rosemary, sage - more than I had ever seen before. They had duck, not just pork chops and meatballs. That seemed interesting to me. After the internship, Zirdziņš offered me a job, but I wanted to move to Riga.

How did you develop your fine sense of food without early exposure to restaurants?

By experimenting. I create what I think is good food. I've always avoided chasing standards dictated by others and focus on what I want to create. Of course there are concepts and locations that set certain boundaries, but even within those I want to build culture. If we stick to serving schnitzel forever, we'll be eating schnitzel for 1000 years. It's important to teach and educate. Take fish, for example. Many people avoid it because of bad experiences, often due to poor preparation. Education is crucial to changing that narrative, and that's a mission I take seriously.

At the heart of my philosophy is the 'wow' factor. When you go to a great restaurant, every detail should amaze you: the food, the design, even the plate itself. Each element has to be unique, because together they tell a story. Take something as simple as a pea puree. We peel every single pea. Most guests don't notice, but when you explain the difference between peeled and unpeeled peas and let them taste it, they can feel it. It's this level of care and precision that makes for a memorable dining experience.

You've been working for years, but people nowadays tend to be quite superficial with one another. Do you ever feel that your long-term efforts are truly seen and appreciated by others?

I don't care about external validation. I'm my own toughest critic. If I have a goal, I pursue it relentlessly. There are days when everyone around me loves everything, but I might find something that doesn't sit right with me, and that alone can make it a bad day. That's the reality.

Everything has to be perfect - not just the dishes and the dining room, but also the invisible aspects behind the scenes. I'm extremely critical, and it's



crucial for me to be better every day than I was vesterday. This isn't just about me; it's about my team as well. It's ingrained in who I am, and there's no other way for me to operate. That's why I don't need motivation from outside sources.

At Steiku Haoss, where I was made head chef at a very young and inexperienced age, there were 600 seats and only two chefs on the team - one handling hot dishes, the other handling cold dishes. It was an incredibly popular steak restaurant, and we were preparing hundreds of portions. Everything had to be fast and precise, with a strict organisational system for inventory and supplies. That experience taught me how to manage

things, because school didn't prepare me for that. I'm incredibly grateful for that experience.

The paradox is that when you're a young chef, you think you know everything, but after working for 20 years, you realise how little you actually know. There's so much to learn about the culinary arts, including their rich history. And with new techniques and ingredients constantly emerging, the learning never stops.

My learning process is hands-on. I love the process; it fascinates me. And I encourage my chefs to do the same – we experiment constantly. For example, the purée on a plate isn't just taken from some book. We've tested 100 different purées, often

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

involving months of work. Sometimes it takes years. For instance, we've spent years on fermentation experiments to discover the perfect recipe.

What's your taste of Latvia?

For me, the taste of Latvia is rooted in the here and now - it's what Latvia is today, not just a memory of the past. It could be something unexpected, like a melon that's now grown locally. Or lemon verbena, a fragrant herb that thrives in our climate. My Latvian taste is defined by ingredients grown here and enjoyed in their natural season.

In January, for example, the menu reflects the winter harvest: game such as venison and pickled mushrooms and root vegetables from the cellar. Winter doesn't just happen; we prepare for it months in advance. September and October are dedicated to preserving, fermenting, and pickling to keep our kitchens stocked until

spring. In March and April, as the snow melts, we begin to transition into the flavours of a new season.

Latvia's culinary bounty is rich and varied. We have incredible fish from our waters, crisp apples from our orchards, and a deep tradition of preserving and transforming what the land provides. Every dish, every ingredient, tells a story of the seasons and the people who make this country what it is.

Is there a Latvian product you haven't mastered yet?

No, because I don't wait. If I come across something that seems challenging, I dive right in. Take lamprey, for example. It's a unique product that's rarely found in many places, and it provokes strong reactions. People either love it or hate it, which makes it difficult to work with.

I was determined to approach lamprey differently and move away from the traditional preparation in jelly. It took months of experimentation to find a way to elevate it, to present it in a fresh, unexpected light. For me, challenges aren't obstacles; they're invitations to innovate. Every product, no matter how complex, is an opportunity to discover something new. bo

FOUR PLACES TO SKI IN THE ALPS THIS WINTER

Having travelled to the Alps for over 50 years and worked in many roles, including as an instructor and now ski writer, the author has been lucky enough to experience many fantastic resorts. Here's his selection of places worth ticking off the list, each for different reasons. Whether you're looking for powder snow, bright lights, or some peace away from the crowds, these destinations offer it all.

The slopes of Verbier

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ADVENTURE GUARANTEED ON AND OFF THE SLOPES Verbier, Switzerland

A recent winner of the World Ski Awards for Switzerland's best ski resort, the village of Verbier, which is located on a gentle slope facing the Mont Blanc range, has always attracted the rich and famous as well as expert skiers looking for adventure. The word 'gentle' may also apply to the pretty wooden-clad chalets that dominate the resort, but its ski slopes are generally far removed from that descriptor. Yes, there's plenty of beginner and intermediate terrain if you want it, especially when venturing into the Four Valleys ski area (which has 400 kilometres of ski runs), but it's the liftaccessed off-piste itinerary runs that draw skiers and snowboarders from across the world to this freeride heaven.

Legendary names such as Vallon d'Arby, Col de Mines, Mont Gelé, and Tortin are all marked on the piste map and patrolled, but they're often left ungroomed, keeping pockets of powder snow for days after a storm. It's perhaps why world-renowned ski photographer Mark Shapiro has made Verbier his home for more than 35 years, capturing iconic images of some of the very best extreme skiers on the planet.

Today, the word 'extreme' has been replaced by the term 'freerider', and Verbier hosts this year's

finals of the World Freeride Tour (March 22 to 30), also known as the Yeti Xtreme Verbier by Honda. This event takes place on the frighteningly steep Bec de Rosses, with a 650-metre vertical drop and slopes of fifty degrees. No, this one is not on the piste map, and only professional skiers should attempt it. After a day of powder snow and steepness, going home for a small nap before dinner just isn't an option in Verbier - the fun continues off the slopes, too.

With an international vibe that includes Scandinavians, Americans, British, and Argentinians, the only qualification required for a good time off the slopes is the ability to keep going from around 4 p.m., when things kick off in après-ski venues such as The Farinet (with live music), to 4 a.m., when the world famous Farm Club closes. Other than that, a little bit of cash might be useful. For those who prefer to relax and eat good food without breaking the bank, try *Fer à Cheval*, an established restaurant on the main road from the Place Centrale to the Médran lift station serving fantastic pizzas, steaks, and more with a clientele that includes locals, seasonaires, and holidaymakers who return year after year for its buzzy, friendly atmosphere. Want to push the credit card limit? Then try La Table d'Adrien in the five-star Chalet d'Adrien. This Michelin-starred establishment attracts discerning diners as well as the odd celebrity – well, perhaps quite a few. Verbier is not only famous for its steep and deep slopes; it's also been a favourite of European royalty for decades.

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Lech-Zürs, Austria

The villages of Lech and Zürs (equalling one ski resort known as Lech-Zürs) are perhaps more discreet than their lively neighbour St. Anton, but they're certainly no less exciting when it comes to the skiing and the scenery. Located in the northwest corner of Austria's Vorarlberg region, the area has one of the best snow records in the Alps and is connected to the Arlberg ski region, the country's largest.

The uber-pretty village of Lech straddles its eponymous river, and the 30-minute walk along its banks through the snow-laden forest ends up at the 100-year-old Älpele hut, an impossibly authentic-looking farmhouse that serves regional cuisine. Or maybe take a Hägglund there, which is a tank-like all-terrain vehicle from Sweden that blasts through the snow. For the more active, the Lech-Zürs ski area delivers something for all skiing levels, with the unique ski circuit known as the White Ring taking centre stage. The 22-kilometre route is suitable for skiers who can handle steeper red runs and relatively easy off-piste terrain, and it mixes both of these together in a full-day excursion (if you take it easy and stop for lunch) that also takes in the



villages of Oberlech and Zug. The latter village has an understated luxury that oozes Austrian charm and sophistication.

There are a number of modern lifts that link the circuit up with the sort of variety of skiing that attracts the same skiers year after year. But take a diversion from the route to the Hotel Zürserhof for lunch or maybe even a spot of tennis - the indoor court high up in the mountains at this five-star hotel in Zürs gets used in the evenings by those who find that skiing doesn't provide quite enough exercise for them. For a more traditional après-ski experience after a full day, try Lech's family-run Hotel Post and its cosy lounge or maybe visit the *Hotel Arlberg* for a tipple - Princess Diana and her sons William and Harry first stayed there in 1991 and continued to do so every year until her death in 1997.

The Arlberg ski region is often referred to as the birthplace of alpine skiing, and its rich history can be felt around every twist and turn on and off the mountain. The Walsermuseum in Lech exhibits both local and ski history, but perhaps ski over to St. Anton via the impressive Flexenbahn cable car (opened in 2016) and visit the Arlberg Museum, which is a must for any ski history geek as it documents the development of the sport over the past 100 years. Back in Lech itself, relax, sit back, enjoy an Austrian dinner, and then head to bed. This is not a big party resort, but you could stop for après-ski in St. Anton and take a taxi back if you fancy a wild night out.



OFTEN MISUNDERSTOOD, RARFLY DISAPPOINTS **Courchevel**. France

The Three Valleys ski area connects Courchevel with Méribel, Val Thorens, and Les Menuires and is the largest lift-connected ski area in the world, with around 600 kilometres of slopes. It's truly vast, and skiers who've been visiting for decades still won't have covered all its terrain. The resort of Courchevel, established in the late 1940s, is a purpose-built haven for skiing set in some of the prettiest scenery in the French Alps on the far left of the Three Valleys area, when looking at a ski map. It consists of four lift-connected villages all set at different levels, and each has its own unique flavour.

Often referred to by their elevations – Courchevel 1850, 1650, 1550, and 1300 - the villages do have proper names. Le Praz, at 1300 metres, is the lowest and is dominated by the towering ski jump used in the 1992 Winter Olympics based in nearby Albertville. Today you can still watch skiers launch into the air in what looks like a seemingly impossible feat of daring.

One step up at 1550 metres is Courchevel Village, a quieter enclave with wooden chalets and apartments that attract families and those looking to avoid the bright lights further up. Facing Courchevel Village, with the spectacular indoor Aquamotion water park splitting the two, is Courchevel Moriond (1650 metres), a buzzy

village with plenty of restaurants, bars, and shops. Try the *Pelican* for live music in the afternoons or the Funky Fox later on at night. Families here have a choice of chalets, hotels, and apartments that offer great connections to the ski area but also relatively good value. The general trend here is that the higher you go, the more you pay.

Look up in the evening to the glittery lights of 1850, simply known as Courchevel, and you'll see one of the world's most famous and exclusive ski resorts. Its array of five-star hotels and spread of *Michelin*-starred restaurants (there's a total of 12 across the villages of Courchevel) is second to none for skiers. Sitting at the very top of that list is the three-starred 1947 à Cheval Blanc restaurant run by Parisian chef Yannick Alléno.

But it's also Courchevel's perfectly groomed pistes that attract skiers looking to boost their egos. Wide, gentle greens such as Bellecôte are great for beginners, while intermediates can enjoy incredibly scenic blue runs, including Creux. But the mix of terrain is what makes Courchevel arguably the best skiing in the Three Valleys region, with the legendary Grand Couloir, a steep descent that pushes even the best skiers, looking down on the green and blue slopes like a giant sentinel. Thankfully, the dedicated beginner zones, magic carpets, and choice of ski schools coupled with the bowl-shaped terrain nurture even the most timid skiers. Relative beginners can even whizz past the multi-million-euro chalets that line the tree-lined slopes into the village and peer into a world that most can only dream of.

Best for perfectly groomed slopes for all abilities, gourmet dining, and familyfocused fun. departing from different airports when differ nay 2

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> Italy's autonomous Aosta Valley region is home to a number of world-class ski resorts, including Courmayeur, Cervinia, and Pila, but the lesserknown village of Champoluc is linked to the secondlargest ski area in the region - the Monterosa, with 180 kilometres of marked slopes. Along with the resorts of Gressoney and Alagna, the area offers some of the longest runs in the Alps (mostly suited for intermediate to advanced skiers), and all sit below some of Europe's highest peaks, which reach elevations of over 4600 metres.

This vast playground includes a huge amount of lift-accessed terrain, both on and off piste, but the area is also home to heliskiing operations, which are relatively difficult to come across in the Alps. Heliskiing comes with a price tag, though, typically around 400 to 500 euros per person, per day for a group of four, which includes one flight and a qualified mountain guide. But the 3000-metre vertical descent ensures plenty of powder snow opportunities for days or even weeks after a big snowfall. Typically, skiers are picked up on the upper slopes of Champoluc, flown across glaciated terrain, dropped off at over 4000 metres, and guided back down by professionals who know the terrain inside and out. Skiers need to be proficient at off-piste skiing



and are issued with avalanche safety equipment that includes a rescue transceiver, snow shovel, and probe. Some skiers also use an airbag, which is a backpack that includes a large balloon that's activated manually if caught in a snow slide to help with flotation on top of the avalanche.

Back down in the traditional and slightly rustic village of Champoluc, life is much calmer. There are wooded slopes above the high valley that sits at around 1500 metres above sea level, and accommodation is mostly in small family-run hotels that provide good value and usually great Italian food as well. This is a simple resort, and you'll find places such as the Ostafa Restaurant on the mountain, which serves up delicious pasta dishes, perhaps with a local sausage, and with prices lower than at most ski resorts across the Alps. During the week, the slopes are almost empty apart from the school holiday times, but weekends can get busy as residents of Turin descend on their second homes, which take up a large number of the apartments here.

About an hour's drive away is the regional capital of Aosta, founded by the Romans in 25 BCE under Emperor Augustus. This historic city with its Roman monuments can serve as a base for Champoluc and the other resorts in the region. Visit at the very end of January to experience the Fiera di Sant'Orso, a traditional event that showcases local crafts, including wood carving, wool, and handmade furniture. 

KIA'S ELECTRIC REVOLUTION

Kia's recently opened EVO plant in Gwangmyeong, South Korea, has become a key force in the company's electrification strategy.

The new plant is designed to produce 150,000 electric vehicles per year, and it is already demonstrating an impressive production volume. The compact *Kia EV3* models are already rolling off assembly lines, and the first cars have arrived in the Baltic countries. Production of the mid-size Kia EV4 electric sedan will soon begin.

The growing speed of the new factory has significantly advanced Kia's strategic plans. The company is committed to pursuing sustainable mobility not only by producing zero-emission cars but also by implementing innovative and more sustainable production methods to increase operational efficiency and reduce environmental impact.

The plant itself is not only an embodiment of technological progress in automotive production but also a great example of industrial architecture conversion. Kia's Gwangmyeong factory, which had been producing small internal combustion engine cars since 1987, has now been transformed into a production centre for all-electric models. The company invested around 270 million euros in this project.

This conversion has allowed Kia to increase production flexibility and meet the rapidly growing global demand for Korean electric vehicles. In addition, the compact production centre is designed with respect for the local environment, reflecting the company's approach to transforming its operations to achieve broader sustainability goals.

Finally, it is not only *Kia* that has seized new opportunities for expansion in the global market. The city of Gwangmyeong itself has strengthened its position as an influential centre for the electricvehicle industry in Asia.

Kia's efforts to transition to next-generation manufacturing technologies offer a glimpse into the future of the automotive industry, as these factories will become an inevitable choice for transportation companies committed to achieving complete carbon neutrality. This will require not only producing zero-emission vehicles from sustainable or recyclable materials but also managing all business processes - from production to operations - sustainably.

'Maximum change through minimum development' is the motto the Koreans used to design the Gwangmyeong EVO production centre. It takes into account the facility's city-centre location, the need to preserve surrounding green spaces, and the creation of the most favourable working conditions for employees.

The factory, which previously assembled internal combustion engine models such as the *Kia Pride*, the Avella, and the Stonic (better known to Europeans), has updated its conveyors and is now rolling out a new generation of products - electric SUVs capable of covering more than 600 kilometres without stopping for a charge.

The factory's body shop, which is equipped with automated forklifts, has become a centre for hightech logistics, while the paint shop's environmental friendliness has been improved by adopting an industrial water-based painting method that replaces the previous oil-based technique.

New equipment has also been installed to reduce the workload on factory workers and eliminate physically demanding procedures. For example, robotic equipment can now independently install high-voltage batteries in electric cars as well as wheels and tires.

Mass production of the EV3 compact electric city SUV has been underway at this plant since the first half of 2024. There are high hopes for this model, as it has established itself in one of the most popular car segments in Europe.

The EV3 version with an 81.4 kWh battery can cover up to 605 kilometres (according to WLTP methodology) on a single charge. If driving only in the city, this distance increases to 773 kilometres. In just 15 minutes, the battery can be recharged with enough energy to cover a range of up to 202 kilometres. Thanks to these specifications and the affordability of the *EV3*, many Europeans will likely choose this model as their sole family car, eliminating the need for a backup vehicle with an internal combustion engine.

The electric car was specially calibrated to meet the expectations of European consumers. Manufacturers paid great attention to steering accuracy and stability on straight roads. As a result, the *EV3* is easy to control on winding suburban roads as well as city streets and highways.

The spacious cabin has an uncluttered interior with a three-part panoramic screen measuring almost 30 inches diagonally. Relaxing seats, cleverly arranged storage spaces, generous legroom and headroom, and state-of-the-art communication technologies guarantee comfortable journeys.


The *EV3* is the third *Kia* model to be built from the ground up as an electric car. In 2022, the EV6 was crowned European Car of the Year, and in 2023 the company introduced its flagship seven-seat EV9both of which have been quite successful.

Built on a global modular platform for electric vehicles, the EV3 is part of Kia's strategy to create a lineup of 11 electric cars by 2026. By 2035, Kia's EV lineup is expected to grow to 15 models, with the company planning to replace its entire European light-vehicle lineup with EVs by then.

Kia plans to launch the EV4 mid-size electric sedan in the first half of 2025. It will also be assembled at the Gwangmyeong EVO plant, which boasts an annual production capacity of 150,000 high-quality electric vehicles. kia.lv; kia.lt; kia.ee







The soup can be found on the menu at any local restaurant, but every family and establishment has its own way of preparing the broth, the noodles, the vegetables, and even the cut of meat, so no two soups are identical. The soup has even received worldwide recognition and a mention in the prestigious Taste Atlas rating, which emphasises its uniqueness. For Moldovans, zeamă is a staple dish on the day

after a wedding.

Like many European nations. Moldovans have a prominent love for flour-based foods. Therefore, it's no surprise that they're especially proud of their own style of filled pasta, whose shell may reach almost half the size of one's palm. The shells are filled with cheese, cabbage, potatoes, or roasted onions. For those with a sweet tooth, they can also be filled with tart cherries. Every Moldovan meal must be accompanied by sour cream and homemade wine, and Moldovan pasta is no exception - these additions enhance the flavour of the dish even more.

FERMENTED **PICKIFS**

In wintertime, no Moldovan feast is imaginable without a variety of produce that was harvested in autumn and then fermented for later use. One such example is pickles, which are the greatest masterpiece a hostess may serve. Made in every household, stored in the basement, and then shared with relatives, friends, and guests interested in Moldovan delicacies, pickles add a pleasant acidic touch to the other dishes on the table.

MAMALIGA Cornmeal porridge

One cannot visit Moldova without tasting the characteristic mamaliga. The thick, appetisingly yellow cornmeal porridge is usually served with pork stew, sour cream, and *brânză* cheese. Thanks to its hearty flavour and thick consistency, it's an especially beloved dish in the cold months of winter

PLĂCINTE Stuffed pies

Nothing compares to Moldovan *plăcinte*. The small pies are available with sweet as well as savoury fillings, so you're sure to find a version to your liking. The savoury pies with meat, potato, or cheese filling can serve as a delicious main dish. The sweet pastries, for their part, feature apples, sour cherries, plums, or pumpkin and make for a wonderful snack or dessert after a hearty meal. Some families use butter to fry plăcinte, while others use oil or lard. The crusts can be made of puff pastry or a leavened dough, and the resulting pastries can be round, spiral, turnover-like, or

half-moon-shaped.

BABĂ NEAGRĂ Cake

When it comes to desserts. the flavourful 'black baba' is the pride of Moldovans. Unique to this small country, it has an interesting consistency that makes it unlike any other cake, cookie, biscuit, or sponge cake. It's porous and rich with an ultratasty caramel flavour that's achieved by a four-hour cooking time, during which the sugar turns dark brown and caramelises.

CUȘMA LUI GUGUȚĂ Filled pancakes

This Moldovan dessert carries an intriguing name – 'Gugută's hat'. Guguță is a local fairytale character who, to protect the residents of his village, hid them under his hat. Consequently, the dessert has all of the good stuff hidden inside a traditional pastry or several layers of crepes. While the traditional version features simple pastry dough that often resembles shortcrust or puff pastry, a more modern and simpler solution is to use crepelike pancakes for the delicious exterior. The traditional filling consists of tart cherries, chocolate, and sour cream - a delicious combination that's very characteristic of Moldova.

CHISINĂUL DF SFARĂ **Chocolate candies**

No dessert table in Moldova is complete without chocolate candies. They're an important part of the local cuisine, with the most prominent type being Chişinăul de seară, or 'Chisinau in the evening'. All one needs to prepare them is cacao, dried plums, and almond butter. This is a great snack made of chocolate and dried fruit to top off any dinner party. Over time, it has also been transformed into a special dessert using all of the same ingredients.

TIPS FOR YOUR NFXT SKI TRIP

Whether you're an experienced skier or planning to embark on your first mountain adventure, here are some pointers for a successful winter journey:

CHOOSE SMART: Different resorts cater to different abilities, so pick one that corresponds to your skills. Likewise, consider your budget, because the price for a day pass varies between resorts.

BOOK EARLY: Popular resorts sell out quickly. The same applies to accommodations the closer the travel date. the more expensive and limited the options are.

BACK TO SCHOOL: Don't rely on your uncle, the selfproclaimed skiing expert. If you're new to the slopes it's helpful to book at least two days at the ski school in order to learn the proper technique.

KNOW THE GRADING: Each resort has slopes of different grading, and the European Slope Grades range from green (easy) to black (advanced).

SAFETY FIRST: Always wear a helmet, and don't ski alone. It can get very sunny on the mountaintops, so apply sun cream to prevent silly ski goggle marks.

DRESS FOR THE OCCASION: Dress in layers. The base laver keeps you dry and sweat-free, the mid layer is for warmth, and the outer layer protects you from moisture and the wind

DON'T OVERDO IT: Once you've booked your tickets, start adding some lowintensity cardio to your daily regimen to build endurance. Once on the slopes, don't wear yourself out in the first couple of days, because there's nothing pleasant about skiing with stiff muscles.

Your plane has been delivered!

Next month, airBaltic will reach a significant milestone by receiving its 50th Airbus A220-300 aircraft.

The acceptance and delivery of planes is a meticulous process, involving a team of airBaltic engineers, technicians, and pilots flying out for the final inspections to Mirabel in Canada, where the A220-300 is assembled. Jānis Bitenieks leads this team, and this will be the llth plane he's delivered. This particular plane will be special in terms of its livery design, which was inspired by suggestions submitted by local and international artists and designers.

Bitenieks has worked at *airBaltic* for 20 years now. After graduating from Riga Technical University, he looked for a relevant job in aviation, focusing in particular on vacancies at airBaltic. And since then, he's never left.

airBaltic was a completely different company back then.

Yes, the company has grown enormously! And when I started, it had other types of aircraft in its fleet: the Fokker 50 and the Boeing 737, which had just joined the fleet at that time.

What were your job responsibilities then? I was a reliability engineer, and I remained in that job for the next 18 years [laughs]. Basically, it means monitoring the efficiency of aircraft maintenance. I collected all kinds of information related to the maintenance of our aircraft, the number of flights, defects, and so on. Then, by analysing this information, various problem areas were identified,

as well as potentially problematic areas, and I had to report this to the management, which in turn made decisions on what to do next. Interestingly, each individual aircraft has its own little nuances, certain areas that require more attention than others.

My job also involved providing feedback to the manufacturer so that it's aware of how the operators of its planes are getting on with any particular aircraft. Because aircraft manufacturers are also involved in the development of corrective actions.

Does that mean you worked on several aircraft types at the same time?

Yes, I had to learn both the Fokker 50 and the *Boeing* 737. Then for a while we had two *Boeing 757s* in the fleet for long-haul flights. Then we got our first Bombardier Dash 8 Q400s, which marked the beginning of *airBaltic's* collaboration with *Bombardier*, the same company that also developed the newest aircraft in our fleet. Back then it was known as the Bombardier CS300, but the programme was later taken over by Airbus.

Now airBaltic's fleet consists solely of new Airbus A220-300s, and it's a very large fleet compared to other operators in Europe, so we've grown very significantly. Since the pandemic, we've been flying with one type of aircraft, which greatly improves efficiency. Naturally, I had to learn this type of aircraft as well.

In late 2022, I was offered a new position as Fleet Project Manager, which means managing various technical projects.

How did your day-to-day routine at work change?

Before, my work was more analytical; now it's more organisational. I'm responsible for several technical projects, including aircraft deliveries, and my job is to coordinate all the parties involved in the projects to make them work efficiently. The work is noticeably more dynamic.

It probably also means that you often travel to Canada?

Yes, Canada already feels a bit like my second home [laughs]. I go there several times a year.

How is an aircraft accepted and delivered?

Once Airbus has assembled the aircraft, I go to Canada with our technical team to take delivery of the aircraft. First, we inspect and check the plane. We also need to do a customer acceptance flight, which means that our airBaltic representatives fly the aircraft for the first time. Test flights are carried out according to a specially defined programme, and the aircraft is tested in various modes. Our pilot makes sure that all the systems work and that they work in accordance with the specifications.

The next stage is a ground inspection, which goes on for several days. The aircraft is parked in a hangar, and our engineers and technician get to work. Also following a set programme, the aircraft is visually inspected from all sides and in all its nooks and crannies.

Aircraft manufacturing involves a lot more manual labour than, for example, car manufacturing, because making an aircraft is much more complex. And, as always, where human hands are involved, there's room for error. So there are several stages to inspecting an aircraft. Stage inspections also take place during production, and our representative in Canada is present for those, too. He follows the whole production process, getting access to areas that are no longer accessible once the aircraft has been assembled.

Everything needs to be checked as well as possible so that we can accept the aircraft and do not need to make any complaints and claims later.

It's a huge responsibility.

In principle, the responsibility lies with the manufacturer. To begin with, the aviation authorities certify not only the design but also the production phases of an aircraft. Therefore, when we arrive at the factory, we're already sure that the aircraft is completely safe, but we nevertheless want to check everything, even the small details that do not affect flight safety but may, for example, cost us extra in the long term. Whether it's a small scratch in the paintwork or something like that.

Each finding needs to be carefully assessed - what's important to fix on the spot in Canada, and what can be accepted and fixed later by our own maintenance staff in Riga

The acceptance process lasts about a week, and then we - the whole team - fly home to Riga in the new plane.

How many people are there in the team? Usually six to ten people: at least three engineers and one technician, one pilot, and myself. A first officer joins us shortly before our departure from Canada. Sometimes we also take some new colleagues along who will eventually take part in the process.

The A220-300 is also a big project and a source of pride for *Airbus*, which regularly participates in various airshows around the world.

Yes, the Airbus marketing programme includes demonstration flights, in which airBaltic has also participated, so that Airbus can show its product to other airlines. I think this process has been very successful for the company, because we're seeing more and more airlines joining the circle of operators for this aircraft model.

I know that you're also an instructor, passing your knowledge on to others.

lose attention.

As our airline grows, we need ever more There are students who are very

new specialists. We need technicians and engineers, and the situation is certainly the same in other departments as well. That's why this cooperation with Liepāja State Technical College is very important for us. interested, actively listening and asking questions. There are also students with previous experience in aviation, and their questions are very specific and serious, so classes often turn into very interesting, meaningful discussions.

Do any of your students now work for *airBaltic*? Yes, I'm very happy to see my former students in the aircraft hangar, already working with the planes. It's nice to see the result of our work. Teaching is an opportunity to influence young people in a positive way.

But life isn't only about flying and planes. I have free time, but I have to find it. Nowadays, it's up to each one of us individually how much free time we have. I get emails on my phone 24/7. My colleagues in Canada only begin working when we're finishing up the day, so my work doesn't stop at 6 p.m.

Self-discipline is important. I can't always just put my phone down and not notice that an email has arrived, but of course it depends on the urgency of the work. If there are projects that need to be finished as soon as possible, then you also have to get involved late at night. But you do need to balance work and leisure.

For me, leisure is often associated with travelling. I like being active in nature hiking, jogging. Travel is my hobby, and my work gives me a significant advantage in this regard. I appreciate the opportunity to fly not only with *airBaltic* but also with other airlines at reduced prices.

Yes, I currently also teach at Liepāja State Technical School, with which airBaltic has a special cooperation programme. These are young, high school-age students, and the important thing is to simply talk to them about what an aircraft consists of, why these particular elements, and so on. It has to be presented as simply as possible, because otherwise students noticeably

5 THINGS THAT CHARACTERISE JĀNIS BITENIEKS' DAY:

Morning routines

For me, every morning begins with a cold shower for an energy boost for the entire day. I also bicycle to the office every day, regardless of the season and the weather. Arriving at my desk in a good mood and with a high level of energy lets me jump straight into the day's tasks.

Planning for the day

My day begins with running through the project statuses and setting the priorities for the day. A cup of black coffee greatly assists in these tasks. This is also a good time to reply to any unanswered e-mails and make sure there are no tasks that have overrun their deadlines.

Collaboration with colleagues

Despite the many opportunities nowadays for working remotely, I highly value personal interaction and face-to-face meetings with my colleagues. This makes information exchange much more efficient and greatly helps in making decisions. We have a very nice and modern office space that facilitates efficient collaboration.

Afternoon meetings

Most of the projects I lead require involvement with Airbus Canada. Due to the time zone difference, their working day starts when it's already late afternoon in Riga, making those few overlapping hours an ideal time for on-line meetings. So, these meetings often make up my afternoon routine.

Non-routines

But routine-wise, no two days are exactly the same in my job. Some projects require travel and working away from home and office. This leads to changes in the workflow, but thanks to modern IT tools and connectivity, I always get the essential updates while keeping track of the current projects.

Uldis Blūms does not remember where his passion for saunas began, but he knows he's been going to saunas for more than ten years. Starting from gatherings with friends who had saunas in their homes or countryside residences, it gradually became a beloved ritual that Uldis enjoys in Latvia as well as on his work trips abroad.

A sauna is a complex experience, and Uldis is passionate about finding the tips and tricks that work for him. The right temperature, the right humidity, swimming before or after the sauna, and long conversations with friends are key aspects for him when it comes to this activity. 'Sauna rituals with friends usually turn into long evenings during which we manage to talk through everything that's happening in our lives,' he says.

There's also no better way to unwind after a long workday than visiting a public sauna. Even though Uldis admits that the public sauna culture in Latvia still has room for improvement, he believes that visiting a sauna at least once every two weeks is a must.

Uldis' work lets him explore his hobby further whenever he has a longer layover in a Scandinavian country, he tries to visit the nearest sauna. He admits that Finnish sauna culture is the most impressive, combining a dining experience, fresh air, and saunas of various temperatures so that everyone can find the one that's best suited for them. He laughs that he's frequented some saunas in Finland so often that the locals already recognise him. 'We've even travelled abroad with friends to visit particular saunas!' he exclaims.

HOW IT ALL BEGAN As a child, Uldis was always indirectly exposed to flying. He lived in Priekuļi, a small town near the Cēsis airfield, and he often heard planes flying overhead and saw people skydiving. He felt the calling but was unsure how to follow it. After graduating from high school, he enrolled in the local aviation institute (which operated under Riga Technical University at the time) as an undergraduate in aviation mechanical engineering.

'I chose this direction to be closer to the aviation industry, but I knew straight away that I wanted to be up in the sky and flying,' Uldis says. He also gradually started pilot training and began working in the business aviation service sector, but he never hid his passion for flying and continued to hope that one day he'd be up in the sky actually managing the aircraft.

So, when the opportunity finally presented itself and an open call for all officers was announced, Uldis' friends and family urged him to finish his pilot studies and apply. He did so, and the rest is history he's been part of airBaltic's flight crew for eight years now. Uldis reminisces that,

back in the day, there was no *airBaltic* Pilot Academy and one actually had to wait for a vacancy to open up, find significant funds to pay for the training, and even travel to other countries to get practical experience. He emphasises that the *airBaltic* Pilot Academy is now the best opportunity for current flying enthusiasts to become pilots. Every day in this job is dynamic and different. But regardless of what surprises a pilot might encounter, Uldis says he'd never give up his job. 'When you do the work you love, no issues ever seem too complicated to conquer,' he concludes, adding that even a bad day eventually comes to an end.

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There are plenty more things Diāna Marta loves about her job. She highlights the opportunity for

growth, as she now also works as a line trainer and ground instructor manager. She explains that she joined the company with no clear idea of where the journey would take her, but it's been an incredible ride since day one. 'The whole aviation industry opens up to you. It's like stepping into a room with a hundred doors. There are so many possibilities,' she says.

Diāna Marta also treasures interacting with passengers, finding joy in making them feel cared for and valued. And, of course, exploring the world, which is something every cabin crew member cherishes. 'Travelling is so accessible when you're in this industry,' she says. 'I've been fortunate to visit so many amazing places, and it's a constant reminder of how lucky I am to experience the world in ways most people can only dream of.'

However, sometimes you may need to carry more but want to avoid waiting for a checked suitcase at the baggage belt. Now you can add an extra four kilograms to your cabin baggage for an additional fee and take a total of 12 kilograms on board.

Please note: If you purchase extra cabin baggage weight, your cabin baggage must still remain within the above-mentioned dimensions. Exceeding the allowed cabin baggage weight or size limits will cost EUR 30 at the airport.

Checked baggage Add checked baggage if you want to take up to 23 kilograms, including liquids over 100 ml, which

are not allowed in cabin baggage. Baggage price varies dynamically depending on the selected route.




